CONSIDER THIS

I have been thinking upon a number of challenges we face in these days, and how to prepare and equip the Church for what is coming. If you read last week's column, you should be somewhat concerned about the future of our world. We know that God is Sovereign and Supreme over all things, but He has also seen fit to give man certain freedoms, and that has given rise to sin and depravity which has affected the entire creation. It is unmistakable that the world is utterly corrupt, and is beyond being saved apart from the Grace of God.

As the Church of Jesus Christ, we are the Body and Bride of Christ, we are here to represent Him on earth in the best way possible until He returns to earth in the clouds. It would be great to know exactly how things are going to unfold, and when, but the Bible did not spell it out in clear English, so we wait and watch for the signs that He has given us. Attenders like you are better judges of whether there is any benefit in coming to services or Bible Studies. It is generally taken for granted that all of us have an active prayer life, but most of us would agree that we don't pray as we should. There is a basic lack of prayer in our world today until there is a major disaster somewhere that gets us praying for a while. We are going to need more study, worship, fellowship, and, in the coming days, the encouragement of group prayer meetings will become life-sustaining.
